

## Victor Ludorum Rules 2017

1. The Victor Ludorum prize will be awarded to the club which has accrued the most points at the British Rowing Masters Championships.
2. In order to accrue points a club must win a medal in that event. In Championship events Gold medals are awarded if 2 crews have entered, Silver medals if 4 crews have entered, and Bronze medals if 6 crews have entered **at time of the draw** In Non-Championship events medals are awarded to the winner of each final.
3. The following points will be awarded for each medal won by each club in Open, Women's and Mixed Championship events:

4. The following points will be awarded for each medal won by each club in all Non-Championship events:

8+	16
4x/4-/4+	12
2x/2-	8
1x	4

5. Points in Championship events will be multiplied by 1.5 for events where 4 or 5 crews have entered.
6. Points in Championship events will be multiplied by 2 for events where 6 or more crews have entered.
7. Points for composite crews will be awarded pro rata to the number of rowing individuals in each crew at the time of the draw. **There will be no change for any subsequent substitutions.** For example in a Championship 4- event with three entries a winning X/Y composite with three rowers from club X and one from club Y will win 18 points for club X and 6 for club Y.
8. A provisional result will be announced at the end of the day's racing and the prize money will be posted to the winning club once the result is confirmed.
9. If racing has to be cancelled the Victor Ludorum prize will only be awarded if, at the point of cancellation, the result is beyond doubt (i.e. the leading club is so far ahead it can't be caught).
10. In the event of any dispute the decision of the Organising Committee is final.
